General graduation requirements:

Students must:

1. Earn a cumulative GPA of 2.0
2. Satisfy a 15 hour residency requirement with Brenau. Experiential, challenge and CLEP credit do not count toward the residency requirement.
3. Accumulate a minimum of 60 hours of academic credit (63 hours if the student took three hours of developmental coursework or 66 hours with six hours of developmental coursework). Students and advisers can track cumulative hours by reviewing the student's transcript via CampusWeb.

If the total number of hours is not at 60 hours (or 63/66 hours depending on the number of developmental courses taken), then the student must take enough hours to reach the correct cumulative total. *If students repeat a course, it is their responsibility to contact the Registrar's Office to adjust the earned hours on their transcript so they are not short hours at graduation.*

Note: Financial aid recipients cannot receive aid for courses repeated unnecessarily or for courses not specifically required for their degree.
