Technique:

Students must take a total of 36 hours of technique. Of those hours, 9 must be in ballet, 9 in modern, and 6 in jazz. Courses may be chosen from DA 201-202, 301-302, 401-402 Ballet Technique, DA 205-206, 305-306, 405-406 Modern Dance Technique, DA 208-209 & 314-315 Jazz Dance, and DA 214 Intermediate Tap Dance. Dance faculty placement is required for all technique courses.

If the student transferred technique from another institution and there are hour-conversion issues, please use the "Notes" area to the right to outline the technique requirements and how they were satisfied.

Electives: Electives are not listed on the program plan by the Admissions Office, however all courses are posted to the student's transcript. Electives needed for graduation can be calculated simply by:

- Adding
 The total number of hours on the student's transcript
 (available in CampusWEB)
 - hours earned for courses taken at the developmental level
 + courses currently registered for
 + courses still outstanding.

A minimum of 120 semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University with a major of dance. After completing liberal education and major requirements, if the total number of hours on the student's transcript is not at 120, then the student must take enough general elective hours to reach a cumulative total of 120 hours. If a course is repeated, it is the student's responsibility to contact the Registrar's Office to adjust the earned hours on their transcript so that they are not short hours at graduation. Due to placement, a student may graduate with more than 120 semester hours.

Students must earn a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 and a major grade point average of 2.50.

Note: Financial aid recipients cannot receive aid for courses repeated unnecessarily or for courses not specifically required for their degree.

Residency requirement:

A residency requirement of 30 semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University. This includes a major residency of 21 semester hours.
