Students must take a total of 26 hours of technique. Of those hours, 6 must be in ballet, 6 in modern, and 6 in jazz. Courses may be chosen from DA 201-202, 301-302, 401-402 Ballet Technique, DA 205-206, 305-306, 405-406 Modern Dance Technique, DA 208-209 & 314-315 Jazz Dance, and DA 214 Intermediate Tap Dance. Dance faculty placement is required for all technique courses.

Place grades on the lines below for each hour of dance completed toward the technique requirement. A grade of "C" or better is required for each technique course. If the student transferred technique from another institution and there are hour-conversion issues, please use the "Notes" area to the right to outline the technique requirements and how they were satisfied.

A minimum of 123 semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University. After completing liberal education and major requirements, if the total number of hours on the student's transcript is not at 123, then the student must take enough general elective hours to reach a cumulative total of 123 hours. If a course is repeated, it is the student's responsibility to contact the Registrar's Office to adjust the earned hours on their transcript so that they are not short hours at graduation. Due to placement, a student may graduate with more than 123 semester hours.

Residency requirement:

A residency requirement of 31 semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University with a dance education major. This includes a major residency of 21 semester hours.
