

**Video Submission for a Dance Major to
Brenau University Dance**

You may submit a link to your video audition. Link must be either in Google Drive or YouTube. Your recording should be 8-12 minutes long.

Dress Code: Women should wear pink tights and a black leotard. Men should wear black tights, dance belt and a white, form fitting shirt. Ballet slippers or pointe shoes (if you have previous experience in pointe work) and jazz oxfords or dance sneakers. Hair should be neatly fastened away from the face. Tights should be footless or convertible so that you can also dance barefoot. No large or dangling jewelry should be worn; watches and bracelets should be removed, and rings that protrude should be taken off. Do not wear baggy, torn, dirty, or stained clothing. Be neat and professional in your dress.

Below are standard technical requirements, but we would also like to see you dance at your best.

1. Include a selection of yourself dancing in the style that you are most comfortable doing. From hip-hop to classical variations, you choose what you would like us to see!

We would also like you to demonstrate your technical level and ability in ballet, modern, and jazz dance.

If possible, you should be videotaped in your current dance classes. The recorded image should show your entire body.

2. The ballet portion should be 4-6 minutes in length. Please perform several barre exercises (plie, tendu, rond de jambe, développés, grand battements) and center floor combinations including adagio, pirouette, petit allegro, and grand allegro. If possible, the camera should be focused on the side of the body during the barre in order to record alignment.
3. The contemporary portion should be 2-3 minutes in length. Perform typical warm-up exercises demonstrating the use of the spine; at least some of these exercises should be performed in a standing position. The recording should also include center and across the floor combinations that demonstrate the use of space.
4. The jazz portion should be 1-2 minutes in length. Perform combinations that demonstrate isolations, style, musicality, and at least one aerial movement.
